One year missed because of weather.
The first invitational was held on October 20, 1970. Eleven (11) schools competed. Seven schools from Baltimore County and the remaining four from other Maryland jurisdictions.

A total of 198 runners competed
A notable fact: Girls were not allowed to run cross country, thus no races. Girls cross country competition started in 1975

Over the years schools competed from almost every jurisdiction in Maryland as well as many schools from Pennsylvania, Delaware, District of Columbia Virginia and West Virginia. Notable that this race secured the Hereford Cross Country as the site for the Maryland State Cross Country Championships for forty of the next 50 years.

The second year saw a jump to 36 schools competing. This was the first year Baltimore City schools competed as well as schools from Pennsylvania.

## The Last Run

The final Hereford Invitational was held in the fall of 1990. Eighty-Two (82) schools competed. There were 800 runners competing in varsity races and 600 in the open/junior varsity races. Times were given for the varsity runners and the junior varsity runners were responsible to check their own times at the finish line. The use of computers for scoring at the time, were cost prohibitive, thus all scoring was completed by hand.
